Duty of Candor Annual Report

Introduction

The Health (Tobacco, Nicotine etc. and Care) Scotland Act 2016 (“The Act”) introduced an Organizational Duty of Candor on health, care and social work services. The Act is supplemented by the Duty of Candor Procedure (Scotland) Regulations 2018, which highlight the procedure to be followed whenever a Duty of Candor incident has been identified.

All health and social care services in Scotland have a Duty of Candor. This is a legal requirement which means that when unintended or unexpected events happen that result in death or harm as defined in the Act, the people affected understand what has happened, receive an apology, and that organisations learn how to improve for the future.

An important part of this duty is that we provide an annual report about how the Duty of Candor is implemented in our service. This short report describes how Abbeyfield Stirling Society has operated the Duty of Candor during the time between 1 April 2019 and 31 March 2020.
